



CONTRACTOR SAFETY NOTIFICATION

Ameriti Manufacturing Company (AMC) is a company that employs a “THINK SAFETY FIRST BEFORE YOU START” philosophy. Our primary goal is to keep our employees and visitors in our facility safe and sound at all times. As a result, thorough and extensive measures have been incorporated to insure that all sub-contractor and/or vendor representatives temporarily working on AMC premises are fully aware of all potentially hazardous conditions and work situations.

The following is a comprehensive list of safety rules and regulations that all sub-contracted and/or vendor representatives must adhere to at all times during the performance of professional services on AMC premises:

- **NO SMOKING** or other tobacco use is permitted anywhere on AMC property. Smoking is **ONLY** permitted in designated areas on Filer St.
- Safety glasses with side shields that comply with ANSI Z87.1 must be worn at all times inside the plant perimeter except in offices, restrooms, break rooms, and locker rooms.
- Hardhats must be worn at all times inside the plant perimeter except in offices, restrooms, break rooms, and locker rooms. Hardhats worn in the plant must comply with ANSI Z89.1.
- Long-sleeved shirts, long pants, and safety-toed shoes must be worn at all times inside the plant perimeter. Visitors to the plant will be outfitted with these items if they do not have them. Contractors ***must supply and wear all required items*** while performing any work on the plant premises.
- Hearing protection must be worn at all times inside the plant perimeter except in offices, restrooms, break rooms, and locker rooms. Signs are clearly posted to reflect this requirement.
- Contractor tools and equipment must be in good working condition and verified as safe to operate (power tools, extension cords, etc.)
- All ladders used, either those supplied by AMC or owned by the sub-contractor, shall be inspected prior to use to ensure they are in a serviceable, working condition and safe to use.
- When entering or exiting any buildings on the premises, pedestrian doors will always be used. *Overhead doors are for vehicle traffic only.*
- No sub-contractor shall be permitted to operate any AMC-owned mobile or power equipment without prior authorization from a member of AMC management. Applicable, *current* licensing must be provided to AMC management before such authorization will be given.
- Lock-out/Tag-out (LOTO) regulations, as set forth in OSHA Regulation 1910.147, shall be adhered to when working in applicably hazardous locations. Any work performed that requires equipment to be locked out or otherwise rendered into a zero-energy state must be coordinated with AMC before said work begins. Each person directly affected by lockout processes must be notified before work begins.
- When performing welding or cutting activities, a fire-watch must be utilized to ensure safety to the individual conducting the hot-work, to the equipment, and to materials. For fire-watch designation and Hot-work permitting, contact AMC management representatives Mr. Keith Berger (Safety Manager) or Mr. Jesse Oliver (Maintenance Supervisor).
- When working overhead or at heights, fall protection must be worn. Fall protection equipment must be as supplied by the sub-contracted company and must comply with AMC requirements. Aerial lift usage must include posting a ground Safety Watch for the entire duration a person is working at height in this



equipment. This watch may be provided by either the contractor or AMC and must be trained on his responsibilities before initiating any work at height.

- Any cutting, welding, grinding operations, or confined space entry, must be reviewed and approved by a qualified AMC management representative prior to the start of any contracted work. Additionally if any
- TIG welding is required onsite, all products and processing equipment must be shielded to preclude a contamination by weld spatter. After welding operations are completed, the welds are to be thoroughly cleaned and inspected along with adjacent surfaces areas. Any TIG welds that come in direct contact with material in the product stream shall be x-ray inspected to ensure the absence of any tungsten particles greater than .38 mm (0.015 inch) in diameter.
- If cellular telephones must be used as part of the job, please step out of known vehicle traffic areas and DO NOT walk around in either the yard or in a department. Phones may be used at specific jobsites as needed, but DO NOT leave the jobsite while using the phone.

Along with these policies, it is the sub-contractor's responsibility to forward current copies of their General Liability, Professional Liability, and Workman's Compensation Insurance certificates to Global Titanium Inc. before starting any work on the premises. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

It shall be the requirement of ALL sub-contractor and/or vendor representatives temporarily working on AMC premises, to present themselves to the AMC Safety Manager, Mr. Keith Berger, prior to the start of any contracted work. At that time, and prior to the start of any contracted work, those individuals will be advised on all applicable safety rules and regulations, and also of any rules and regulations that may be of special concern at the assigned area(s) of work operations.

Signatory approval of these TERMS AND CONDITIONS, by an authorized representative of the contracted company/vendor, signifies that all company personnel assigned to the contracted work have been informed of the safety rules and regulations outlined herein. In addition, it shall be understood that failure to follow any/all of the outlined safety rules and regulations, as well as to meet the TERMS AND CONDITIONS as stated within this Contractor Safety Awareness Notification, will result in a temporary halt to assigned



contract work, the possibility of suspension/termination of the assigned work, and the additional possibility of physical harm or death to those personnel not adhering to applicable safety rules and regulations.

Signatory approval of these TERMS AND CONDITIONS, by an authorized representative of the contracted company/vendor, also signifies that AMC shall not be held responsible or liable for physical harm or death resulting from the failure to the outlined safety rules and regulations, as well as failure to meet the TERMS AND CONDITIONS as stated within this Contractor Safety Awareness Notification.
